Tabz from Southport and Area Schools Worker Trust came in to deliver an exciting assembly based around our current school value, 'Trust.' The assembly was very interactive and involved exploring what we mean by 'Trust' and also how we can show it. A huge thank you to Tabz for sharing this assembly and for always making it fun and exciting for our children.



Things started brilliantly in the first game against Norwood, when Oliver played a pin point pass to Harrison who then beat two defenders before confidently slotting home the opener. Theo scored his first goal of the game firing back the clearance straight threw to the back of the net. Finley soon added a third before Theo rounded off the scoring calming tapping home a rebound after Isaac had he shot blocked. The next game was against OLOL and couldn't have started better with Harrison's free kick flying into the back of the net, soon he had goal number 2 after beautifully cutting inside his defender and finishing in to the far corner. Then it was his hat trick with a well placed finished. Finally a OLOL own goal gave them a fourth goal late on. A tough game against Kew Woods saw the boys narrowly lose despite good chances and Leighton making a couple of great saves to keep the team in the game. The final group game saw confidence restored with Finley this time scoring a hat trick with composed finishes including his second goal where he turned 3 defenders inside out before firing past the goal keeper. As well as Theo showing strikers instinct to follow in and hammer home from close range. Thomas was called into action on a couple of occasions but did well to come out quickly make the save.

In the first game for the Year 4's they found themselves go a goal behind very early but turned it round when firstly Jason fed the ball to Alex who made no mistake with is shot. The winner came when late pressure forced an own goal from the Farnborough defender. They then controlled the game against the first of two Norwood teams in the group with Harrison latching on to a back pass to then finish well. Harrison then turned provider to Finley, who volleyed home into the top corner. Harrison rounded off the scoring with his second of the game. A tougher game against the second Norwood team saw a narrow defeat that on another day could have gone our way. A slower start against Larkfield eventually came to life when Thomas forced a good save. Before Alex found the net after beating his defender. Harrison and Finley both added to their tally for the day before Alex wrapped it with a late fourth goal. This left the boys with another second place finish in the group which wasn't enough to reach the final but we are incredibly proud of their efforts.

Across both tournaments the boys did an excellent job of representing St John's and shows there is plenty of promise for the future.
