#### <u>Uniform</u>

As we have now returned to school from a lovely break, I would just like to remind parents and pupils of a few uniform expectations at St. John's so that we can ensure ALL children are smart and ready for learning.

- We ask that long hair is tied back please. No ornate hair decorations; keep it simple for school. We will remind children if needed.
- Please ensure ALL items are named. If doing so in pen, please check regularly. It is impossible to keep an eye on every single item and the interesting places children leave/lose them! Named = an easy return to owner!
- Jewellery is not permitted apart from stud earrings and watches. No chains or bracelets should be worn UNLESS for religious religions (please see Mr Thomson if so). Earrings should be removed or taped over for PE.
- Make up and nail varnish should not be worn. If worn or applied at weekends/holidays, it should be removed prior to school and we will ask children to remove if necessary.
- On PE days, it is fine for children to come to school in joggers, leggings, tracksuits etc as we want to be outside where possible. However, any clothing should be as plain as possible and ideally black or grey. It is fine to wear uniform on PE days if children do not have these items.

- Normal school shoes should be black. Trainer style is fine but again these should be black. Thank you for your cooperation in ensuring all pupils are smart, ready to learn and represent St. John's beautifully. Pupils are proud of their school and showing respect for our expectations on uniform and presentation is a key way of showing how fantastic we are. Our uniform is readily available at Whitakers and Zips for Snips and we only ask for cardigans or jumpers to bear our logo (polos are fine to be plain white). If you ever need any aspect of uniform, please ask at the office or catch Ms Bishop as we some items in school.
